DOC should conduct a review and revision of property policies and procedures.	<ul> <li>The Washington State Penitentiary has created a facility workgroup to ensure that the facility, as a whole, is processing the issuing and packing of an incarcerated individual's property consistently and in accordance to policy.</li> <li>The facility has started the process of training facility staff on proper procedure when handling an incarcerated person's personal property; to include updating the OMNI system, proper documentation, abiding by timeframe regulations, and ensuring accountability for the inventories of property</li> </ul>
Establish a DOC-wide recognized process for tort claim investigation processes, including a checklist for all necessary evidence, and ensure that anyone authorized to conduct a tort claim investigation has received proper training in order to properly and thoroughly execute the investigation.	Washington State Penitentiary will also be conducting monthly reviews of all grievances and tort claims to evaluate the procedures were followed and ensuring the correct actions were taken by staff.

The information provided by the OCO was useful to ensure the Department of Corrections is doing everything it can to keep an incarcerated person's property safe during their time in the agency's facilities.

We also appreciate your team's understanding of the unique processes across facilities and the addition of policies and procedures being put in place to address them. Moving forward,
